2020 was a year that presented Books & Beyond with plenty of challenges. As an NGO with a unique structure, we took it upon ourselves to take those challenges head on, utilizing our efficiency and adaptability to create unique solutions. Instead of cancelling our classes due to COVID-19, we transformed our curriculum into Zoom-friendly programs so that we could stay connected to our students. This academic year we conducted 70% more Interactive Storytelling classes and added new initiatives (e.g. Mentorship Program) to our holistic English Reading Enrichment Scheme.



I would like to thank more than 1,000 Books & Beyond volunteers for their continued hard work, effort, and energy to serve. Most of all, I would like to recognize their resilience for persisting through this difficult period.

In the coming months, we will continue expanding our work with junior secondary school students through the Conversations That Matter program. We will also continue focusing on providing high quality curriculums to our partner schools and recruiting motivated volunteer teachers in our programs.

Beyond our work, we will continue developing our leadership teams to better achieve our goals. Due to the conditions we have faced this year, we have placed an emphasis on utilizing technology to ensure that our manpower is effectively deployed. Finally, we will further expand our service by seeking more long-term partnerships with our supporters.

Our mission, as ever, is to unlock the potential in all our children and our volunteers. I am excited to the growth of Books & Beyond and working together to ensure even more young people are given the priceless learning of English language and personal development.




Our Mission: We promote Social Emotional Learning to develop the skills, empathy and resilience to help our students build confidence, so they can positively contribute to any community.

The ethos of our programs is based upon the five principles of Social-Emotional Learning.







What Did We Do To Face The Covid-19 Challenges





Interactive Storytelling Program

Due to school closure because of Covid-19 starting from January 2020, we could only conduct 80 in-person classes out of the 220 scheduled classes. To continue the program, we swiftly redesigned the program format from in-person classes to Zoom classes. By creating 30 new Zoom lesson plans with animated onscreen games, videos and improvised role-play based on a new small class setting, the students were more engaged with the learning content.

The platform enabled us to further collaborate with volunteers without physical boundaries or time zone restrictions from the likes of Credit Suisse Singapore, UC Berkeley alumni in San Francisco, BlackRock and more.

At the end of the academic year of 2020, we conducted a total 377 Interactive Storytelling Classes which exceeded our schedule by 70%.





Reading Marathon Program



Since all Reading Marathon in-the-classroom activities were cancelled, we produced 10 reading and writing skills videos with the help of our video production volunteers and 230 fun exercises by our 2 IT professionals to upgrade the e-learning platform.

The videos helped students learn applicable skills that helped them excel in reading and writing online.

Since some of the students were not in Hong Kong, total number of unique reading of this academic year was 2,520 which was slightly below our target of 3,000.



Listening Enhancement Program

We kicked off the new Listening Enhancement Program in one of our partner schools with great success.

Besides the 10 classroom sessions we conducted before Covid-19, we recruited 40 script writers, graphic designers and video producers to produce 89 English listening skills videos. They not only allowed students to learn the 13 skills in depth, but also note-taking techniques that are transferable to all subjects. Over 880 exercises were submitted by 55 students.

The school teacher reported that the student's mock tests have improved by 40% as a result of learning from our program.







Mentorship Program

Students moving from primary to secondary school are entering a new phase of their lives. We addressed these challenges by creating the transition to secondary school Mentorship Program.

32 mentors and mentees were paired up for this program. Mentors supported their students' academic development and motivated students to expand their life perspectives.

FUNDING INITIATIVE

Books & Beyond Reading Club receives no government funding or support. We provide our English Reading Enrichment Program to 20 partner schools at no charge with the support of more than 1,000 corporate and individual volunteers.

The minimal expenses of the organization are funded by donation received from individuals and Books & Beyond Angel Fund of the Founder.

As we continue to exponentially grow, we have appointed additional senior management team members to oversee the increasing demands of different operational aspect of each program.


